## Step 2 - What is the most important information about the who or what?

- What information relates to the:
  - $\circ$  who or what,
  - o culminating question, and/or
  - o essential word(s)?
- Be sure to check pictures, captions, and headings.

#### Step 3 - Write a gist statement.

- Be sure your statement identifies:
  - $\circ$  the most important who or what and
  - the most important information about the who or what.
- Be sure your statement includes:
  - o a capital letter,
  - $\circ$  a period, and
  - o approximately 10 words.

#### Step 2 - Get the gist.

### **Cue Card**

Step 1 - Partner 1 reads the section.

**Step 2** - Partner 2 answers the comprehension question.

**Step 3** - Partner 1 indicates whether they agree or disagree with Partner 2's answer and explains why using information from the text or from prior knowledge.

"I agree because the text says..."

"I disagree because the text says... So, I think..."

"I agree/disagree because I learned in essential words/comprehension canopy..."

**Step 4** – Partners switch roles and repeat steps 1 through 3 for the next section of text.
